

## **Basket Lattice**

The Basket Lattice is a traditional pattern first published in the early 1920's by Ladies' Art Company. Using fabric strip sets and partial seams, we'll bring this traditional pattern into the 21<sup>st</sup> century and construct a lap quilt that will have others wondering how it was put together! It's up to you whether or not to share how easy it is.

#### Supplies:

- 40 different 2 ½" x 44" strips for lattice (jelly roll works great!)
- 2 yards for background and binding (black used in sample)
- Rotary cutter, ruler ( 2 ½" x 6 ½" is perfect) and small mat (instructions will be sent for cutting before class)
- 3 ½ yards of backing fabric (not needed for class)
- 4 ziplock bags for organizing sub units
- **Required pattern** – "Basket Lattice" by Sheri Pape Designs The pattern is readily available on the Internet or can be purchased from the teacher with prior arrangement. **Pattern cost is \$9.**
