

Carpenter's Square – 60"x60"

This is a complicated looking quilt but not complicated to make. It looks like small pieces are sewn together, but actually strips are added to a sliced fabric, sewn together, cut apart again and re-sewn with remaining strips. It can be dynamic or soft depending on fabrics used.

In 2 ½ Days students will finish construction including borders!

Supplies :

- Main Focus Fabric 1 1/3 yard in ONE piece pressed and lightly starched
- Strips 1 yard each of 2 fabrics Trim off selvages, cut 16 strips of each, PARALLEL to selvage so strips are 36" long. In other words, you are cutting strips the length of the fabric, not the width. We can do this in class.
- Inner Border – ½ yard
- Outer Border – 1 yard
- Basic Sewing kit (snips, ripper, rotary cutter with new blade, cutting mat, permanent pen)
- If you have the following, Please bring it – 24x6" or larger ruler, 20 ½ " square ruler, folding 24" ruler. I will be bringing mine. Please do not buy them for this class.
- Sewing Machine, cleaned with new needle, ¼" foot, foot pedal and cord!
