


Basket Lattice

From an early age Susan has loved creating with fabric. With a background in education and over 20 years in the classroom, her students have ranged in age from senior citizens to preschoolers. While still in high school she was given the opportunity to work with younger students on sewing projects and has continued providing formal and informal instruction to both children and adults throughout the years. She enjoys giving her students the confidence to try new techniques and celebrates along with them when they complete their project. Her classes in local quilt shops for the past 25 years have included among other topics, mystery quilts, kids' classes and a popular "Bag Ladies" series. She serves as a pattern tester for Lazy Girl Designs and strives to present easy to understand instructions that lead to a successful finish. Susan has won ribbons for her quilts in the Aiken County Historical Museum's annual quilt show, but her most satisfying awards are the smiles on the faces of her family as they curl up with one of her quilts.

The traditional basket lattice pattern has been updated to use strip sets. Using 2 1/2" strips (a jelly roll is perfect!) and a background fabric, various sub-units are constructed and then assembled into a 58" x 70" lap quilt. The first part of the class will be dedicated to unit construction and the second part to final assembly. The use of partial seams makes assembly easy. Some precutting before class will maximize sewing time.

Basket Lattice pattern by Sheri Pape (may be ordered ahead of time from the instructor)

Basic machine sewing supplies

40 - 2 1/2" x wof strips (jelly rolls work well)

2 yards background fabric, includes binding...should contrast with the strips

3 1/2 yards backing (not needed for class)
