Susan started quilting in 1993 when she became engaged and her godmother told her she would need a hobby. She took her to Piece Goods (at the time) and purchased everything she would need to make her first quilt. That day and evening, they washed, pressed and cut a queen sized bargello quilt! She taught her how to piece one small section and flew home to Wisconsin! Susan was left to figure the rest out on her own. She finally finished that quilt in 2001 and has been hooked since!

She always has a little busy bag with a hand work project with her because you never know when you will have some time to stitch!

The small quilt we will make in class will just be to learn the technique. It will measure approximately 16" x 16" when we finish, and will be great to use for a pillow front. Susan will be in touch with more details if you enroll in her class.

There is a lot of pressing in this technique. I have always used steam because this how I was "raised" as I was taught to quilt. It is once again your preference. You may bring your own pressing area and we will see what the facility will take.

1 day class - Thursday

Supply List:

- 16 - 9 1/2" squares of background fabric (all the same or a variety of similar tones)
- 16 - 2 1/2" squares of accent (all the same or different, the sample is made with a variety of blues. You could select a favorite holiday fabric and make a pillow)
- Sewing machine with thread to match your background
- Appliqué thread to match your background (I like Select by YLI, but bring what you like)
- Appliqué needle (Choose a needle that you are comfortable with but is small enough to hide your HAND stitches. The current needle I am using is by Roxanne).
- Thimble if you like (I need mine)
- Basic sewing supplies (scissors, pins, thread, seam ripper, etc.)
- A chop stick or knitting needle to use to turn the "pockets"
- Hand full of safety pins
