

## **Tic-Tac-Toe 63x63”**

A modern take on a very traditional block – The curved log cabin is a fun block with almost endless possibilities for layout. Logs of different widths give the illusion of curves. The layout I chose reminded me of the game I learned as a child.

This project is for all skill levels, confident beginner to advanced quilter. Students will learn how to accurately piece the blocks, sew strata for the borders as well as the basics for paper piecing the cornerstones. The center of the quilt is traditional piecing while the border combines paper-pieced cornerstones with strata-pieced piano keys. Tips and tricks for design, assembly and squaring up will be presented. Different layout options will also be offered.

#### Supplies:

- Basic sewing supplies including machine in good working order, mat and rotary cutter.
- Skinny Logs – 2 1/8 yards
- Dark Logs – 1 1/2 yards
- Medium logs 1 1/4 yards
- Light logs 1 yard
- Center Squares 3/4 yard
- Binding 1/2 yard
- Backing and Batting approximately 4 yards

This project can be made scrappy using a variety of fabrics in one or more of the log colorways. Scrap yardage should total a little more than the yardage shown. Yardage has been calculated assuming 40” of usable width of fabric.
