Do you agonize over the dreaded “Y” seams? If the answer is yes, then this is the quilt for you. Create a beautiful nosegay quilt with blocks that look difficult but are easy to construct. Nosegays can be made using a variety of colors, or dig into your basket of scraps and make them using a variety of yellows, oranges, blues, greens, purples etc.. You can easily adjust the finished size by adding or subtracting rows of blocks. You can also set this block in a variety of ways.

2 day class - Friday and Saturday

Fabric Requirements:

- 1 1/4 yards solid green for Cone Template A and cornerstones
- 3/4 yard green print for setting triangles and corners in block
- 6 yards pink background for Cone Templates B & BR, corners, rectangles and half-squares
- 2 yards burgundy print for squares and half square triangle units
- 2 1/2 yards solid green border
- 5/8 yard burgundy print for binding
- 8 1/2 yards backing
- Batting 94” x 94”

Pattern Required - \$9.00

Optional Applique:

- 1/2 yard for bias vines
- Burgundy print scraps for flowers



General Instructions:

Size 88” x 88” or smaller sizes available

1. Lightly spray starch all fabric before cutting
2. Accurate **scant** 1/2” seam allowances
3. Press all seams open
4. Square up each to 3 1/2” or 6 1/2” section for accuracy
5. Layout block as you construct it - further instructions will be sent from the instructor when we have the class list.

Other Supplies in Addition to Basic Sewing Supplies:

1. Clear Template Plastic 8 1/2” x 11” or buy Teflon Sheets from the dollar store
2. 6 1/2” square up ruler
3. 6” by 12 1/2” ruler
4. Lead pencil
5. Paper scissors
